Many said during introductions that they wanted to "get closer to God." Through informative talks by the volunteers; chapel meditations by the volunteer clergy; table discussions; poster-making; lots of music; and the eating of yummy, non-prison food, the participants were able to begin to break down their protective walls and let God in. One gal at my Martha family table commented at the forgiveness service that "something real is happening here!" Surely, God was at work in that place!
