THE LESSON Acts 2:1-21

The people sit

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth

below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

Updated COVID Guidance

All of us at St John's—congregation, clergy, and staff—have done a magnificent job of keeping one another safe during the time of COVID. We have been diligent about following the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Episcopal Church, the Diocese of Southwest Florida, and our local authorities.

As you know, the CDC recently issued new guidance to the effect that "fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance."

Therefore, effective next Sunday, May 30:

- All fully vaccinated ministers, adult acolytes, vergers, and musicians in the chancel may stop wearing masks. Youth acolytes who are not fully vaccinated will continue to wear masks during the worship service.
- Capacity in the body of the church will no longer be limited to 100 people.
- All fully vaccinated members of the congregation are welcome to participate in worship without masks if they so choose.
- A seating area will be designated (and clearly marked) for those members of the congregation who are not fully vaccinated or who prefer to continue mask wearing and social distancing for their own comfort and the safety of their loved ones.

We will continue Holy Communion in one kind only and without kneeling at the rail.

All of us at St John's—congregation, clergy, and staff—have done a magnificent job of keeping one another safe during the time of COVID. We have been diligent about following the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Episcopal Church, the Diocese of Southwest Florida, and our local authorities.

As you know, the CDC recently issued new guidance to the effect that "fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance." (People are considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson's Janssen vaccine.)

In response, Bishop Smith immediately offered the following advice to the churches of the Diocese of Southwest Florida:

- For fully vaccinated people, mask wearing and social distancing are optional.
- For non-vaccinated individuals, mask wearing and social distancing are highly recommended.
- For the time being, guidelines for Holy Communion will remain the same.
- You may also consider designating an area for those who desire to continue social distancing.

The Wardens, Vestry and staff of St John's are in agreement that, while the COVID pandemic is by no means over, we can make some changes to our worship services that will move us towards greater freedom and normalcy while continuing to keep everyone safe and comfortable. **Effective on Sunday, May 30**:

- All fully vaccinated ministers, adult acolytes, vergers, and musicians in the chancel may stop wearing masks. Youth acolytes who are not fully vaccinated will continue to wear masks during the worship service.
- Capacity in the body of the church will no longer be limited to 100 people.
- All fully vaccinated members of the congregation are welcome to participate in worship without masks if they so choose.
- A seating area will be designated (and clearly marked) for those members of the
 congregation who are not fully vaccinated or who prefer to continue mask wearing and
 social distancing for their own comfort and the safety of their loved ones.

We will continue Holy Communion in one kind only and without kneeling at the rail.

We recommend that everyone practice safe distancing when entering and leaving the church and while seated, and we strongly encourage all parishioners to be vaccinated. In the words of Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, "The Bible says you should love your neighbor as yourself. And getting this vaccine... (is one of the) real ways that we can love our neighbor as ourselves. To love our neighbor, and while you're at it to love yourself."
