All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

Epiphany Mass: January 6

Join us for our Epiphany service at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 6. Epiphany commemorates the visit of the Magi and traditionally marks the close of the Christmas season. This will be a Said Mass in the chapel. The Feast of the Epiphany is also known as "Three Kings Day" and "Manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ to the Gentiles," for this is the day we commemorate the visit of the Three Wisemen from the Orient who offered the baby Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh as described in Matthew 2. This mysterious visit alludes to the fact that Jesus is royalty - the King of Kings through David's line to be the savior of the world (gold), that he is worthy of worship (incense is used in prayer), and that he is both Priest and Sacrifice (myrrh is infused with oil for priestly anointing as well as in burial services). The fact that three noblemen from the far Eastern parts of the world were drawn to find Jesus foreshadows that through Jesus's earthly ministry and victory over the grave at Easter, a saving relationship with God is offered to all peoples of the earth.

The Epiphany is the 12th and final day of the Christmas season. During the service on the 6th, the celebrant will bless chalk for Epiphany house blessings. All are invited to attend this special service and take home some chalk to bless your home for the new year.
