THE EPISTLE



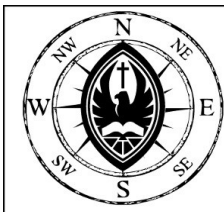

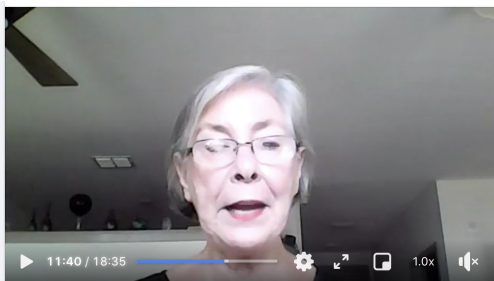
