Isaiah 25:1-9

He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. "But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

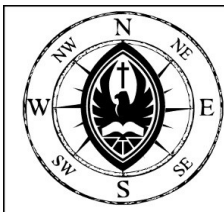

Faith Café Volunteer Opportunities

Beginning Monday, October 5, Faith Cafe will inaugurate “Hot Meals to Go,” the first step toward resumption of full meal and other support services for those in need. To accomplish this, we will need six volunteers for the St. John’s team, which serves on the 3rd and 4th Fridays of each month. Three volunteers will be in the kitchen plating the protein, grain, and vegetable that Metropolitan Ministries provides and three will dispense the lidded disposable plates of food at the front door. Guests will eat outside, as they are currently doing, but the meal will be like the more substantial one they were served prior to the pandemic. Face masks will continue to be required for volunteers, and actual contact with any individual guest is brief and distant.

We also need a volunteer to pick up the three large containers of hot food at Metropolitan Ministries on Florida Ave. around 10:30 a.m. on those Fridays and return the empty containers. Using a truck or a large car (like an SUV) that allows sliding the heavy containers in and out works best.

Volunteers are needed on Fridays, the dates are October 16 and 23, November 20 and 27, and December 18 and 25.
