2 Peter 1:13-21

Lector A Reading from the Second Letter of Peter.

I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to refresh your memory, since I know that my death will come soon, as indeed our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things. For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must

understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

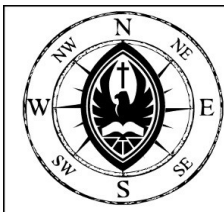

Planning for our Future: The St. John's Endowment

Did you know that St. John's established an Endowment Fund nearly twenty years ago with a purpose of "enabling the Parish to fulfill more completely its mission through the development and enhancement of the Parish, its facilities, and the parish's ministries, including but not limited to the Parish's Day School?" The Endowment operates as a trust that oversees the investment management of contributed funds by BT Wealth Management (the investment management division of the Bank of Tampa). As of June 30, 2023, the balances of the two accounts under management are \$454,805.40 for the Church and \$609,404.59 for the School.

Chaired by Steve Straske, the Endowment Board's other voting members are Fr. Chris Wood, Drew Graham (Treasurer), Tom Cassedy (Secretary), Roddy Belfatti, Max Grimard, and Chris Rainey (School Board member), and the ex officio, non-voting members are the Senior Warden (Sarah Bricklemeyer) and the School Board Chair (Julie Harrington). The Endowment makes annual distributions in support of the Church and School in accordance with its distribution policy – in recent years, approximately 4% of each Fund's balance has been distributed annually. This policy allows the total value of the Endowment to grow over time, while also sharing some of each Fund's balance annually to support the operations of the Church and School in perpetuity.
