#### THE EPISTLE

1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

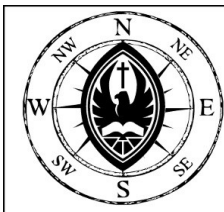

## Faith Café Volunteer Opportunities

Faith Cafe has inaugurated “Hot Meals to Go,” the first step toward resumption of full meal and other support services for those in need. To accomplish this, we need six volunteers for the St. John’s team, which serves on the 3rd and 4th Fridays of each month. Three volunteers will be in the kitchen plating the protein, grain, and vegetable that Metropolitan Ministries provides and three will dispense the lidded disposable plates of food at the front door. Guests will eat outside, as they are currently doing, but the meal will be like the more substantial one they were served prior to the pandemic. Face masks will continue to be required for volunteers, and contact is brief and distant.

We also need a volunteer to pick up the three large containers of hot food at Metropolitan Ministries on Florida Ave. around 10:30 a.m. on those Fridays and return the empty containers. Using a truck or a large car (like an SUV) that allows sliding the heavy containers in and out works best.

Volunteers are needed on Fridays, October 23, November 20 and 27, and December 18 and 25.
